It articulates economic policies and structural reforms as well as sector-based expenditure programs that the County intends to implement in line with the Annual Development Plan 2018/2019 in realization of Migori County Integrated Development Plan 2018-2022.

The Medium-Term Expenditure Framework aims at ensuring efficiency and effectiveness in the implementation of the development activities outlined in the 2018/2019 Annual Development Plan. This is important to create fiscal space for financing priority projects by the departments in the County.

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#### CHAPTER ONE: COUNTY STRATEGIC BLUEPRINT

#### Overview

- The 2017 Fiscal Strategy Paper identifies the broad strategic priorities and policy goals that will guide the County Government in preparing its budget for Financial Year (FY) 2018/2019 and the Medium Term.
- The paper discusses the performance of the FY 2017/2018 budget up to 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2017 which forms the basis for projecting the financial outlook with respect to the County Government revenues and expenditures for FY 2018/2019 and over the Medium Term.
- 3 The County priorities outlined in this paper shall form the basis for formulation of FY 2018/2019 budget and the Medium Term. The framework ensures adherence to principles of public finance and fiscal responsibility principles as set out in the Constitution and the Public Finance Management Act, 2012. Specifically, the paper will ensure that the recurrent to development expenditures ratio has been maintained within the required ratio of 70:30. It will detail on how the expenditures will be funded fully from the allocations from the equitable share, Local revenue sources and revenue from the development partners.
- 4 The paper covers the following broad areas: review of the fiscal performance of first five months of the FY 2017/2018; highlights of the recent economic developments and economic outlook; broad strategic priorities and policies for FY 2018/2019 as spelled out in the Annual Development Plan and the Medium Term Fiscal Framework as outlined in the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP) 2018-2022.
- 5 During the medium term plan the following areas of concern shall be given priority as articulated in the 2018-2022 CIDP and Governor's manifesto;
  - i. Infrastructural development.
  - ii. Enhancing food security.
- iii. Enhancing Health, environment, water and sanitation.
- iv. Promotion of quality technical education
- v. Promotion of trade and industrialisation
- vi. Ensuring sustainable urbanisation
- vii. Promotion of good governance

Addressing these priorities through a pro-poor approach shall go a long way to address the high poverty levels that have afflicted the citizens of Migori County over the years. In addition, the lives of the people shall be transformed through increase in employment levels, income levels and high quality of life for the residents.

- This fiscal strategy paper articulates economic policies and structural reforms as well as sector-based expenditure programmes that the county intends to implement in order to achieve the broad goal of its development agenda. In particular, it emphasizes continued shift of resources in favour of programmes that enhance growth and job creation, and to support stronger private sector investment in pursuit of new opportunities in a changing economic environment. The proposed fiscal framework ensures continued fiscal discipline and provides support for sustained growth, broad based development and employment growth that benefits all citizens.
- The County Government of Migori will build on the comparative advantage in resource availability and enhance fiscal discipline to navigate through the challenges posed by the global and domestic development in order to sustain and improve the resilience of the county economy.
- With limited resources, the County government will be required to be more efficient to make meaningful gains in poverty reduction. The fiscal framework outlined in this Fiscal Strategy Paper (FSP) requires greater fiscal discipline and alignment of resources and priorities. In particular, better control of expenditure and a clear focus on core mandates by county departments will be required. Thus, in preparing the 2018/2019 budget, departments will be expected to identify savings that will contribute to financing the county government's targeted outcomes in line with the CIDP.

#### **Objective**

- The objective of the 2018 Fiscal Strategy Paper is to set the frame work for the preparation of the County budget. It is a requirement under section 117 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 that each County Treasury shall prepare and submit to the County Executive Committee the Fiscal Strategy Paper for approval, and the County Treasury shall submit the approved Fiscal Strategy Paper to the County Assembly by the 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2018. This Fiscal Strategy Paper contains the following:
  - The principles that will guide the 2018/2019 budgetary process;
  - The broad fiscal parameters for the 2018/2019 budget and the key strategies and policies for management of revenues and expenditures;

- The broad strategic priorities and policy goals that will guide the preparation of the budget over the medium term;
- A discussion of risks to the budget parameters and Budget Strategies;
- The medium–term outlook for county government revenues and expenditures;
- A discussion of how the Budget Strategies relates to the County priorities as drawn from the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP); and
- A framework for the preparation of departmental forward budget estimates and the development of detailed budget policies.

#### Outline of the 2018/2019 Fiscal Strategy Paper

- 11. The Fiscal Strategy Paper is presented in seven Chapters. Chapter One presents an overview of the County Strategic Blueprint, Chapter Two outlines the economic context within which the 2018/2019 budget will be prepared, the recent economic developments and the macroeconomic outlook covering the global, national and domestic scene.
- 12. Chapter Three presents the Fiscal Performance and the emerging challenges during the first half of 2017/18 Financial year while Chapter Four outlines the macroeconomic policies, outlook and strategies that the county has put in place to achieve medium term outlook as contained in the CIDP 2018/22.
- 13. Chapter Five outlines the resource envelope medium-term expenditure estimates and spending priorities for the proposed 2018/2019 budget and medium term. Sector achievements and priorities are also reviewed. Chapter Six contains the Fiscal Policy and Budget Framework that will support planned growth over the medium to long term, while continuing to provide sufficient resources to support programmes earmarked for implementation during the plan period.
- 13. Chapter Seven outlines the issues and proposals from the public hearings on CFSP and 2018/19 MTEF budget.

## CHAPTER TWO: RECENT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTS AND POLICY OUTLOOK

#### **Gross Domestic Product (GDP)**

- 14. Despite the slow recovery in the global economy as well as that of sub Saharan African region, the Kenya's economic performance remains strong registering high growth rates of 5.8 per cent in 2016 up from 5.7 per cent in 2015. The stable macroeconomic environment, increased government investment spending, increased consumer demand and the continued recovery in the tourism sector continues to support this growth.
- 15. This momentum continued in 2017 with a growth of 5.0 per cent in the second quarter, up from 4.7 per cent in the first quarter as shown in **Figure 1** below. The strong growth in the second quarter of 2017 was due to stable macroeconomic conditions and robust activities in accommodation and restaurant (13.4 per cent), real estate (9.7 per cent), Information and communication (9.2 per cent), trade (2.8 per cent).

#### **Inflation Rates**

Overall month on month inflation declined to 7.1 per cent in September 2017 (within government target range of 5+/-2.5 per cent) from 8.0 per cent in August 2017 (**Figure 2**). The decline was due to the fall in the cost of some food items, mainly attributed to improved supply of goods and services as compared to august 2017 which experienced subdued supply. In the

twelve months to September 2017, the average annual inflation rate was 8.4 per cent compared to 6.5 per cent in the same period in 2016.

#### **Kenya Shilling Exchange Rate**




FIGURE 3: KENYA SHILLING EXCHANGE RATE

16. The Kenya Shilling exchange rate remained broadly stable against major international currencies. In September 2017, against the dollar, the Shilling depreciated by around 1.8 per cent in nominal terms to close at Kshs 103.1 from Kshs 101.3 in September 2016. Against the Euro and the Sterling pound, the Shilling weakened to Kshs 122.9 and Kshs 137.0 in September 2017 from Kshs 113.5 and Kshs 133.2 in September 2016, respectively (Figure 3).

Overall average annual inflation

- 14. The national government cumulative revenue collection for the period July to September, 2017 amounted to Kshs 345.6 billion (Equivalent to 3.9 per cent of GDP) against a target of Kshs 388.0 billion (Equivalent to 4.4 per cent of GDP). This represented an underperformance of Kshs. 42.5 billion this was due to shortfalls in Income Tax and Excise Duty.
- 15. The total cumulative expenditure and net lending inclusive of transfers to County governments for the period ending 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 amounted to Kshs 412.3 billion which was Kshs 43.4 billion less against the target of Kshs 455.6 billion. This was largely attributed to low absorption levels in operations and maintenance, wages and salaries for the national government.

#### Implications of the Recent Economic Development on the Economy of Migori County

- 17. As the result of the above positive economic development, the economy of Migori benefited as follows:
  - a) The reduced interest rates enabled investors to access bank loans at concessionary rates translating to increased investments in the building industry currently witnessed in major towns of Migori, Awendo, Rongo and Isebania.
  - **b)** The reduced inflation rate has resulted to reduced prices of common goods thus enabling most contractors to complete their works within the stipulated time and cost.
  - c) The favourable weather conditions resulted to good harvest in the sugarcane, maize and other agricultural products consequently, resulting to reduced incidences of food insecurity compared to the previous years.
  - **d)** Reduced revenue generation resulted in delayed remittances to the county fund kitty, delayed salaries and commencement of project.

#### Risks to the Economic Outlook

14. The risks to the economic outlook for 2018/19 includes both external and fiscal risks which may impact negatively on the economic performance of the county

#### **External Risks:**

15. The external risks to the economic outlook of the county for the financial year 2018/19 and medium-term include weakening in global economic growth and unfavourable weather conditions should there be any drought or floods in the year. Other risks are frequent power blackouts, crop failure and high cost of production.

#### **Fiscal Risks:**

- 16. Delays in remittances to the county shall lead to
- 17. Inadequate infrastructure particularly roads, electricity and other social amenities could affect the level and rate of private investment in the county. The County Government will strive to

- ensure conducive environment for the investors through infrastructure development across the county. This will boost various sectors such as tourism, agriculture and trade.
- 18. The increasing county wage bill which is expected to clock 43.8 per cent of the total expenditure in 2018/19, if unmanaged may affect the economic growth of the County through decreased allocation of funds to development projects.
- 19. Revenue collection risks may also affect the economic outlook of the County due to the shortfall of the actual revenue from the targeted revenue. Efficient measures will have to be put in place to reduce the gaps between the target and the actual revenue collected including the adoption of automated revenue collection systems among other measures.

# CHAPTER THREE: FISCAL PERFORMANCE AND EMERGING CHALLENGES FOR THE $1^{\rm ST}$ HALF 2017/18FY

20. The implementation of the budget for FY 2017/18 has progressed well despite various challenges in the first half period such as prolonged electioneering period which resulted to minimal economic activities, low investment and delayed disbursement of funds by the National Government. Revenues collection also lagged behind significantly and with rising expenditure pressures arising from the increasing wage bill. These three combined effects disrupted smooth flow of funds for development and general county government operations in the first quarter.

#### **County Own Revenue**

- 21. During the first six months of the 2017/2018 FY, the cumulative revenue raised by the Migori County Government amounted to KES 52.8 million which was 11.56% of the annual local revenue target. This is against a target of KES 225 Million for the same period (first six months of 2017/18 FY). This represents a revenue deficit of Kshs 172.2 million (representing 76.89 per cent deviation from the planned target).
- 22. The county was able to collect high amount of revenue in the months of July and September with the rest of the months collection being lower that KES 10 Million per month. The reason for this deviation was attributed to the prolonged and unfavourable electioneering period which reduced economic activities in the county.

The table below shows the monthly locally collected revenue from July 2017 to December 2017.




Figure 4: Monthly Locally Collected Revenue Collection - July To December, 2017

23. Some sectors continued to perform well despite the challenges faced during the first half of the 2017/18 financial year. However, only three revenue sources collected revenue in excess of KES 5 Million namely Bus Parks, Market dues and C/A.C/F, SH fees. The table below shows the top six performing revenue sources during the first six months of the 2017/18 financial year.

24. Major drop in local revenue collection can be attributed to six major revenue items with Permit Renewals/Applications recording the biggest drop from Kshs 2.77 Million in the first quarter to Kshs 872 Million in the second quarter. The Veterinary department did not record any collection in the second quarter.

#### **County Expenditures**

#### **Development and Recurrent Expenditures**

25. In the period under review, the total cumulative Expenditure was KES 2.29 Billion against a target of KES 3.89 Billion for the same period, representing 58.87 per cent of the targeted budget for the same period. The County Executive spent KES 1.455 Billion (63.5%) while the County Assembly spent KES 244 Million (36.5%). Analysis of the County expenditure by economic classification indicates that Kshs 0.595 Billion was used for development activities against a target of 1.44 Billion for the same period while KES 1.699 Billion was used for recurrent activities against a target of 2.45 Billion accounting for 26 per cent and 74 per cent of the total actual expenditure for the same period respectively. The county absorption rate for the recurrent expenditure against the budget stood at 34.6 per cent.

26. Overall, most of the sectors had lower absorption rates of less than 45%. This could be attributed to delays in disbursement of funds by the exchequer. Only Agriculture, Livestock Production, Fisheries and Veterinary Services sector recorded absorption of more than 50%.

27. To adhere to the financial regulations, the County Treasury shall ensure that no department shall spend more than the exchequer releases and expenditures remains within the departmental ceilings as we move towards the closure of 2017/18 FY.

#### **Wages Expenditure**

Revised estimates have continued to grow from 1.3 Billion in the year 2013/14 FY to 2.8 Billion in 2017/18 FY representing an increase of 1.5 Billion. In 2017/18 FY for instance addition of 264 Million is required thus raising it to Kshs 2,877,490,391 from Kshs 2,613,230,560, an equivalent of 43.8% of the total county allocation (equitable share and locally collected revenue).

#### **Revised Estimates/ expenditures**

28. Supplementary budget was necessitated in order to factor in the following issues which were not factored in the 2017/18 FY budget:

- 1) Inclusion of Opening Balance of Kshs 829,190,572 being expenditures incurred in FY 2016/17 but not yet cleared by 30<sup>th</sup> June 2017, hence, captured as expenditure during the period under review i.e. 2017/18
- 2) Downward adjustment of locally collected revenue from projected Kshs 450 million to Kshs 150 million
- 3) Inclusion of donor funds and conditional grants totalling Kshs 262,484,792 and a reduction of KDSP funds by Kshs 103,669,006
- 4) Reduction of the equitable share by Kshs 258,466,066
- 5) Exclusion of Conditional allocation free maternal Health by Kshs 165,043,200
- 6) Increment of Road maintenance fuel levy fund by Kshs 71,502,816

As a result of the changes in item 2 and 4 above, the county's overall budget was reduced by Kshs 558 million. In order to absorb this deficit, and maintain a balanced budget, sectors budgets were reduced as follows:

## CHAPTER FOUR: MACROECONOMIC POLICIES, OUTLOOK AND STRATEGIES TO ACHIEVE MEDIUM TERM OUTLOOK

Building on the progress made during the first CIDP, and with the desire to decisively confront the challenges of poverty, unemployment etc that this county continues to face, the government has identified seven key strategic areas of focus over the next five years that will accelerate broad based economic growth. This will help transform the lives of the people of Migori. The strategic areas include:

- 1. Infrastructural development
- 2. Food security
- 3. Health, Environment, Water and Sanitation
- 4. Quality technical education
- 5. Trade and industrialisation
- 6. Urbanisation
- 7. Good governance

#### Strategy One: Infrastructural Expansion to Facilitate Economic Growth

#### (i) Expanding Road network

- 29. In order to ensure sustained economic transformation and open the rural markets for competitive economy, the county government of Migori embarked on massive investments in upgrading and opening of rural access roads. Other activities included gravelling of the existing roads, tarmacking of key road, construction of footbridges and culverts and routine maintenance of the roads across the county.
- 30. Over the medium term, the strategy is to develop the road transport in order to have an effective, efficient and secure road network, The County government will continue to enhance road network connectivity across the county with the aim of enhancing trade, commerce, agricultural productivity and inter county and sub-county trade.

#### (ii) Access to Adequate, Affordable and Reliable Energy Supply

- 31. The realization of the development objectives set out in the County Government's economic transformation agenda (CIDP) and Vision 2030 will be feasible if quality energy services are availed in a sustainable, competitive, cost effective and affordable manner to all sectors of the economy up to the village level.
- 32. In order to provide affordable and competitive energy to transform the rural economy of the people of Migori, the County Government has planned to provide solar lamps particularly to the rural poor and vulnerable homes. This is in addition to provision of street lights in all the major towns and markets across the county with the view of enhancing and promoting small scale trade.

#### (i) ICT

The County recognizes ICT as a prerequisite for economic development and has therefore initiated major steps to promote its use. The County's objective of a knowledge-based economy aims at shifting the current industrial development path towards innovation where creation,

adoption, adaption and use of knowledge remain the key source of economic growth. During the first CIDP the subsector targeted to develop the county ICT infrastructure, develop ICT policies, legal and institutional and regulatory framework and improve public service delivery through the use of ICT applications. The county made a tremendous progress in ICT infrastructure development. Construction of citizen/ICT centre, county digital branding through LED screens/billboards, construction of TV and Radio station, structured cabling, purchase of computer hardware and accessories and storage equipment and acquisition of word processing and operating systems are some of the achievements the county made in infrastructure development.

During the plan period, the county shall prioritise formulation of policies and regulatory framework that shall ensure smooth running of the sector's operations and also guide the relationship with other stakeholders. Other priorities include increasing access to internet connections by ensuring that ICT development, implementation and exploitation are an integral and sustainable component of development by equipping TVETs for ICT high end skills development and internship programs and establishment of ICT rooms in the resource centres. This shall require that the county recruits and trains ICT staff who shall ensure smooth running of the department across the county.

The county shall also effectively engage with the public in dissemination of information through developing an environment that values data and information sharing culture, streamline governance structures for managing information sharing. This shall be achieved through utilization of ICT (social media) to disseminate county specific communication, use of the county's major languages for communication in radio and TV

In addition, the county government shall strive at increasing access to county government services by providing the integrated infrastructure backbone required to enable cost effective delivery of ICT products to its citizens, businesses and other stakeholders by consolidating, developing and implementing shared infrastructure and services management policies, standards and structures.

#### **Strategy Two: Food security**

- 33. Agriculture is one of the key sectors aimed at delivering the 10 percent economic growth under Vision 2030. In addition, majority of the Migori population live in rural areas and derive their livelihood from agriculture. Therefore, promoting substantial investments in agriculture is key to our economic transformation. Improving agricultural productivity and value addition would thus be an effective way to enhance food security, employment creation, and income generation
- 34. The county government has over the years put in place policies, strategies and interventions to ensure sustainable food security in the county including; provision of farms inputs to farmers; provision of tissue culture bananas and promotion of rice farming; Purchase of tractors; construction and equipping of Miyare ATC; Distribution of dairy cows to farmers in all 40 Wards; Purchase of bee hives and distribution of honey extractors to various groups in Nyatike and Suna West sub counties. Other projects include; Rehabilitation of cattle dips; Construction of slaughter houses and supply of Monosex fish.

35. During the medium term the County Government priority investments shall include; research and extension services, enhanced food security through provision of agricultural inputs, dairy animals and water dams; marketing; value addition and agricultural extension services. It will also develop appropriate policies and strategies to eliminate middlemen in all areas of agricultural marketing and establish community and village markets to improve food security and increase household income.

#### Strategy Three: Enhanced Health, water and sanitation and environmental conservation

36. In order to ensure sustained economic transformation, reduce the burden of economic shocks on the households and enhance access to services by most people in the county, the county government will continue to invest in quality and accessible health care services and quality education as well as strengthening the social safety nets programme as detailed below:

#### Health Care

37. The main strategy includes; scaling up universal health coverage initiatives including free maternity services, equipping public hospitals with specialized medical equipment, reducing morbidity and mortality from malaria, HIV/AIDs, tuberculosis and non-communicable diseases and recruitment of more health workers and strengthening the supply of drugs for improved quality of health will continue to be implemented in this fiscal year.

#### Water Accessibility

- 38. Indeed, safe drinking water and sanitation do complement efforts towards improved primary health care and productivity of labour. For this reason, the County Government of Migori will continue to invest in clean water supply, harvest rain water as well as continue constructing dams and water pans.
- 39. Over the medium term, the County Government will prioritize construction and equipping of boreholes, water pans, protection of springs and rehabilitation of existing dams and p a n s.

#### **Environmental Management**

- 40. The County government recognizes that protecting and conserving the environment, underpinned by effective climate change mitigation and adaptation measures is fundamental to sustain access to clean water, clean environment and a healthy productive population.
- 41. In order to mitigate the impact of climate change, the County Government will continue to mainstream climate change measures into its projects and programmes. This includes: tree planting and re-forestation in all public primary institutions throughout the county.

#### Strategy Four: Promotion of trade and industrialization

In order to reduce unemployment levels and also improve the hygiene and sanitation in the market centres, the county invested in construction and fencing of open air markets and construction of VIP latrines in the market centres. This significantly led to reduction in outbreak

of water-borne diseases and also increase in the local revenue collected from the markets. The traders are now able to sell their goods in a safe environment.

Going forward the county government shall continue to put more investments in establishment of more markets, construction of toilets and also fencing of the existing open-air markets. In addition, more resources shall be put in promotion of industries in the county to promote value addition. Such industries include establishment of sweet potato processing plants, fish cooling plants close to the Lake etc.

Other sectors such as hotel industries shall continue to be promoted. The county shall strive to reduce the red tape and encourage more investors to set up their hotels which shall be expected to ensure that the tourism sector also flourishes.

The county shall also promote tourism by mapping and potential tourism sites and also development and protection of cultural and heritage sites.

#### Strategy Five: Enhancing quality technical education

- 42. The county government is committed to enhanced access to basic education and raising the quality and relevance of education to ensure equity as well as exploitation of knowledge for competitiveness with a view to achieving Education for all pupils in the county.
- 43. Going forward, the medium-term strategy will focus on:
  - Improving, equipping and expanding ECD school and polytechnics institutions infrastructure through construction/rehabilitation of classrooms, provision of tools and other teaching aids;
  - Increasing provision of student loans, bursaries and scholarships to fully finance the universal free primary education, free day secondary education and tertiary education.
  - Recruitment of ECD teachers and other tertiary instructors in order to enforce and uphold quality education;

#### Strategy Six: Ensuring sustainable urbanization

With the rapid development and expansion of market centres to town and urban areas, it is expected that the urbanization shall continue to increase across the county. This calls for the county government to ensure that settlements are done at the relevant sites and also social amenities are provided to the urban population. The county has been able to develop several town plans in order to regulate land use in the towns.

Going forward in the medium term the county shall continue to develop town plans for the remaining towns in the county, allocate land for special activities such as waste disposal sites. More efforts shall be made to ensure that the plans are adhered to in order to curb the development of slums in the county and also to reduce the encroachment of public land and road reserves.

Provision of infrastructure in town shall continue to be a priority for the county. Such infrastructure includes tarmacking of key roads, establishment of health and education facilities to the county residents and also water and sewerage systems.

#### **Strategy Seven: Good governance**

This is a key area of focus for the county since without good governance all the other areas of focus cannot be achieved. In the previous plan period the county put more emphasis in prudent utilization, management and accounting of county resources, streamlining measures aimed at rejuvenating revenue generation and staff rationalization and training.

Going forward, the county government shall continue to build on the above successes to ensure efficient and effective provision of services to the county residents. Leakages in the local revenue processes shall also be reduced in addition to promotion of transparency and accountability in all the county activities.

The county shall also continue to involve the public in all the decisions as stipulated in the Constitution of Kenya 2010. The Constitution makes citizen participation a central part of Kenya's governance system. Participation of the people is recognized in Article 10 of the Constitution of Kenya as one of national values and principles of governance. Further Article 174(c) provides that the object of devolution is to: "enhance the participation of people in the exercise of the powers of the State and in making decisions affecting them." The centrality of public participation cannot therefore be over-emphasized.

## CHAPTER FIVE: BUDGET FOR THE FY 2018/19 AND THE MEDIUM TERM

#### **Revenue projections**

44. Migori County has two main sources of funding that is revenue from local sources and the equitable share from the National Government as provided under the Constitution. In the FY 2018/19, revenue collection is projected at Kshs 450m while equitable share is expected to slightly improve to ksh6.6b from Kshs 6.4b in 2017/18FY as contained in the Budget Policy Statement 2018.

#### **Expenditure projections**

45. Expenditure estimates for each sector, shall be distributed as shown in the table below based on the projected estimates in the equitable share of ksh 6.6b in order to realize the anticipated county medium-term objectives as articulated in the Annual Development Plan and the CIDP 2018-2022. However, the final allocations to sectors shall be determined once the CARA 2018 is approved.

#### **Details of Sector Priorities**

46. The future county's medium-term expenditure estimates will ensure the resource allocation is done based on the prioritised programmes aligned with the CIDP, the Kenya Vision 2030 and other policy initiatives that ensure accelerated growth, wealth and employment creation and also poverty reduction within the county.

#### **County Assembly**

47. This is a key sector in the implementation of development programmes in the county as it has the oversight role. It also plays the role of strengthening the democratic space and governance in the county. Due to the crucial role of the sector, it is proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 736.791 Million** to cater for operations and development activities in 2018/19 FY.

#### **County Executive**

- 48. This is the sector that is in charge of enhancing public service delivery, organization and coordination of County Government business through planning, mobilization of financial and human resources in the public sector. The sector also plays the role of linking the rest of the world in matters of development. The sector is comprised of the Governor, Deputy Governor, CECs, County Secretary, chief of staff, county treasury, CPSB, sub-county and ward administrators, Chief Officers and staff at the governor's office.
- 49. This sector requires considerable funding to oversee the implementation of the Kenyan Constitution, Vision 2030, CIDP, provision of leadership and policies in governing of the county. It has the task of supervising the County Government departments including overseeing the special programmes on youths, women and persons with disability.
- 50. Due to the vital role, the sector plays, it's proposed that it be allocated **Kshs 468.78 Million** in 2018/19 FY to cover both recurrent and development activities.

#### Roads, Public Works and Infrastructure

- 51. The priority includes areas in Roads, bridges, foot bridges, bitumen road construction, and purchase of road equipment. The overall goal of the priority is to have a well-developed and maintained physical road network for rapid and sustainable economic growth and poverty reduction. The development of infrastructure has a multiplier effect on the county economy as it enhances access to markets, improves trade and contributes towards the creation of many entrepreneurial related jobs. Funds will be apportioned to create and maintain a network of roads, bridges that will provide adequate and efficient transport of farm produce to the markets.
- 52. In order to achieve these programmes, it is proposed that the sector be allocated **Kshs 934.86 Million** in the 2018/19 FY.

#### **Public Service Management**

- 53. The sector plays a key role in enhancing public service delivery, organization and coordination of County Government business. The sector is expected to provide leadership and policy direction in the governance of the county; coordinate and supervise County Government affairs; articulate and implement the county's policies, promote efficient and effective human resource management and development for improved public service delivery, and public service integrity.
- 54. The sector has achieved the following: Establishment of the organizational structures, construction of sub-county and ward offices and renovation of the public service offices among other achievements. They intend to construct the remaining ward and subcounty offices including renovation of the existing ones.
- 55. To achieve the above objectives, it is proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 501.216 Million** in the 2018/2019 FY.

#### **County Public Service Board**

56. This is a key department in the management of public servants in the County. In order for the department to successfully accomplish its mandate, it is proposed that the sector be allocated **Kshs 40.28 Million** in FY 2018/2019.

#### Agriculture, Water, Livestock and Fisheries

- 57. This sector is critical to the county's economic growth, employment creation and poverty reduction. The sector contains multiple linkages with other key sectors such as manufacturing, wholesale and retail, transport and distribution and other service related sectors. The challenges facing the sector include; low value addition and competitiveness, inadequate physical infrastructure, Poor quality breeding stock and lack of livestock breeding centre in the county, low production and productivity due to the use of uncertified seeds, poor marketing and marketing infrastructure, and low access to financial services as well as affordable credit.
- 58. The sector aims to address the above challenges in the 2018/2019 budget by raising agricultural productivity through provision of farm inputs to needy farmers, construction of 2 dams per sub-county, increased agricultural commercialization through value addition, improvement in the provision of extension services; improved livestock breeds through artificial insemination; purchase of dairy cows, adoption of appropriate livestock production technologies; introduction of traditional food crops; land development, and promotion of sustainable management of fisheries.
- 59. To achieve the above targets, it is proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 345.224 Million** 2018/2019 FY for recurrent and development activities.

#### **Education, Culture and Sports**

60. The County is assigned pre-primary education, village polytechnics, sports, culture and Youth development. The mandate of the sectors includes: dissemination and implementation of

Education policies, Administration and Management of Education programmes and construction and equipping of ECDE schools among others. The sector faces many challenges including inadequate infrastructure, inadequate learning materials and staffing. During the previous year, the sector has managed to construct 120 ECDE classrooms, 10 Youth Polytechnics and supported several activities in the sports arena. In the FY 2018/2019, the sector intends to construct ECD classrooms, purchase learning materials, recruit teachers and construct an ECDE training college. For youth polytechnics, the sector intends to construct workshops and classrooms, purchase tools, and recruit instructors.

- 61. Other priorities of the sector are to establish a cultural centre in the county, organize sports, and establish sports centres and talent centres.
- 62. Efforts shall be made to address social and economic issues affecting the vulnerable groups in the county, promote cultural heritage, empower youth, women and people living with disabilities.
- 63. Special efforts shall be made to address the educational needs from the disadvantaged groups through provision of bursaries, scholarship and the commencement of the school feeding programme.
- 64. In order for this sector to effectively cater for these objectives, it is proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 385.832 Million** in FY 2018/2019.

#### **Environment and Disaster Management**

- 65. This is a critical sector in the county economy charged with the responsibility to promote, conserve, and protect the environment to reduce the occurrences of disaster through community empowerment and enforcement of existing legislation for sustainable county development. During the period under review, the sector has managed to undertake the following: establishment of a demonstration farm, Riverine conservation, Promotion of onfarm tree growing and trained tree seedlings producer and community on Disaster Risk Reduction strategies.
- 66. Under the disaster response management, the sector aims to purchase disaster emergency supplies, engine and construction of county environment disaster centre. Under forestry, the sector intends to do reforestation of degraded hill tops and promote farm trees including purchase of tree seedlings. In public health services, the sector intends to construct solid waste management facilities and identify and protect of dumping sites in all major towns and purchase garbage transport trucks among other priorities.
- 67. It is proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 125.76 Million** in FY 2018/2019.

#### **Finance and Economic Planning**

68. This is one sector that links all the departments in the county and the county with the rest of the world. The key role of the sector is to provide leadership and policy direction in the

governance of the County, coordination and supervision of County affairs, promote sound public financial and economic management for socio-economic development, promote macroeconomic stability, planning and budgetary process, implementation, monitoring and evaluation. In the last one year, the sector has put mechanisms in place for smooth functioning of the treasury, IFMIS and the preparation of the County Integrated Development plan.

69. The sector targets to track all development projects and programmes; prepare quarterly briefs or reports on development; enhance revenue collection; source for development partners and ensure that funds in the county are prudently utilized to achieve the county objectives and the realization of the vision 2030. To achieve these objectives, it's proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 712.387 Million** in 2018/19 FY.

#### **Health Services**

- 70. This is a key sector in the development in any economy and therefore, it is one of the County priorities. The goal of the sector is to provide equitable and affordable health care to the people of Migori County. The aim of the sector is to improve immunization coverage, reduce deaths due to malaria and other diseases, and increase the proportion of mothers delivering in health facilities among others. However, the sector is facing numerous challenges ranging from inadequate infrastructure for service delivery to shortage of personnel and untimely supply of drugs.
- 71. The County Government will try to address these challenges through continued investment in training of health workers, upgrading and equipping of health facilities, construction of maternity wards, laboratories and ICU, completion of Migori MTC, purchasing ambulances for all health facilities in the long-run and allocating more resources to the procurement of drugs.
- 72. It is proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 1.579 Billion** in FY 2018/2019.

#### Land, Housing, Physical Planning and Urban development

- 73. This sector is in charge of lands, survey and physical planning of the county. The sector faces many challenges ranging from lack of town plans, GIS, lack of proper register of public land, lack of urban development plans and shortage of dwelling units.
- 74. So far over the last one year the sector has achieved the following; Demarcated and beaconed over 12 public titled land, surveyed over 10 acquired sites to be titled and converted into public land, resolved over 40 land related conflicts and issued over 2000 new parcel numbers to facilitate production of Title deeds.
- 75. To address the above shortcomings, the sector intends to prepare town plans for all major towns in the county, prepare county spatial plan, fast track the issuance of land documents and prepare an integrated urban development plans among others.

76. To achieve the above targets, in the FY 2018/2019, it has been proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 122.92 Million**.

#### Trade Development, Regulation and Industry

- 77. The sector has been entrusted with the following sub-sectors; Trade, cooperatives, weight and measures, tourism and industrialization. The mandate of the sector includes facilitating trade and investment by creating enabling environment and infrastructure development, facilitating the development of cooperative movements to ensure that they are vibrant and self-reliant through savings mobilization, education and training. Ensuring fair trade practices and consumer protection. Facilitating product development, innovations and marketing tourism products.
- 78. However, the sector is facing many challenges ranging from high cost of production, stiff competition from accessing international markets and congestion in Migori Town.
- 79. To achieve the sector's goals, it is proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 108.62 Million** in FY 2018/2019.

#### Information, Communication and Technology

- 80. Over the past one year, the sector achieved the following; website design, setting up local area network, installation and configuration of network bandwidth, establishment of digital villages, structured network cabling, wiring of fibre cable, unified network security management system, design and implementation of citizen service charters, installation of window server 2012, installation and configuration of IPBX system, automation of revenue collection system, among others.
- 81. To achieve its mandate, it is proposed that the sector be allocated **KES 200. Million** in FY 2018/2019.

#### Water and Energy

- 82. The sector's mandate includes provision of clean safe water for use in rural and urban areas and promotion of cheap alternate sources of energy. Over the years the sector has drilled boreholes, sunk shallow wells, protected springs, connected water to the town residents, constructed water pans for human and animals use across the county. Other achievements include installation of street lights in market centres across the county
- 83. Going forward the water subsector has prioritised the following: expansion/rehabilitation of existing piped water supply systems, drilling boreholes and equipping them, supporting roof harvesting in public institutions, construction of dams and protection of water springs.

- 84. In the energy, sub-sector, the following have been earmarked: supply and installation of solar street lights in major towns and markets, installation of solar PV in county headquarters and provision of solar lamps in villages among other priorities.
- 85. To achieve these targets, it is proposed that the sector be allocated **Kshs 392.948 Million** in FY 2018/19 for development activities.

#### CHAPTER SIX: FISCAL POLICY AND BUDGET FRAMEWORK

#### Overview

- 16. The Migori County Medium-Term Fiscal Framework emphasizes the following keys measures: Retaining the ratio of recurrent expenditure on county budget to around 70 percent to 30 percent of recurrent to development through efficient spending as well as improved revenue collection following reforms as spelled out in the Migori County Finance Bill 2017.
  - ✓ That the level of expenditure is adequate to sustain county development investment in the following seven key priority areas: infrastructure development; good governance; quality technical education; food security; trade and industrialisation; health, environment, water and sanitation; and urbanisation
  - ✓ The improvement of expenditure while at the same time ensuring that adequate resources are available for operations and maintenance, and the implementation of the Migori CIDP.
  - ✓ That all measures shall be instituted to contain the wage bill and maintain a balanced budget in 2018/2019 Financial Year and the subsequent years.

# **Fiscal Responsibility Principles**

- 17. The County Government acknowledges the fact that the fiscal stance it takes today will have implications into the future. The County Government will ensure strict adherence to Section 107 of the Public Finance Management (PFM) Act of 2012 which outlines the fiscal responsibility principles as follows;
  - ✓ The County Government's expenditure shall not exceed its total allocation in that financial year
  - ✓ Thirty percent of all expenditure is dedicated to development expenditure and seventy per cent to recurrent expenditure over the medium term;
  - ✓ Wage bill shall be limited to not more than thirty five percent of the government's total revenue:
  - ✓ County Debt financing to be only used for development over the medium term.
  - ✓ The County Government's borrowings shall be used only for the purpose of financing development expenditure and not for recurrent expenditure;
  - ✓ Sustainable debt: The County's debt shall be maintained at a sustainable level not exceeding fifteen percent of the County Government's total revenue as approved by the County Assembly. Short term borrowing shall be restricted to management of cash flows and shall not exceed five percent of the most recent audited County Government revenue.
  - ✓ Prudent risk management: Fiscal risks shall be managed prudently and key areas of uncertainty that may have a material effect on the fiscal outlook and the potential policy decisions outlined

- ✓ Predictable taxes: A reasonable degree of predictability to the level of tax rates and tax bases shall be maintained, taking into account any tax reforms that may be made in the future.
- ✓ The County Government will operate under a balanced budget fiscal regime. National and foreign borrowing will be limited to projects that guarantee revenue streams and support long-term growth.

# CHAPTER SEVEN: ISSUES AND PROPOSAL FROM PUBLIC HEARINGS ON CFSP AND MTEF 2018/2019 BUDGET

86. The Constitution of Kenya 2010 and Section 117 (5) of PFM Act, 2012 provides that the public should be involved in the budget making process through public participation. Members of the public were invited to attend public sector hearings to identify priorities that will guide the preparation of the County Fiscal Strategy Paper leading to the County Budget 2018/19 Financial Year..
